



What Happens During The Procedure?

Once placed inside the peripheral vasculature using a pin-sized entry through the skin, the tiny rotating tip of the ClariVein® catheter is set in motion to treat the inside of the vessel delivering medicine specified by your doctor. The medicine is delivered through the unique rotating tip of the catheter allowing for 360 degree coverage of the vessel.

The procedure typically takes very little time and creates minimal discomfort.



What Happens After The Procedure?

Follow your doctor's instructions for care after your procedure. In some cases rapid return to normal activities can be expected.



- Can be performed in your doctor's office
- Typically takes very little time
